This rare early example of this award dates from the papacy of Pope Leo XIII (1878-1903) and was originally awarded circa 1885. It is ready for wear with a new watered silk collar. The Order of the Holy Sepulchre was founded by Godefroy de Bouillon, leader of the First Crusade, who captured Jerusalem from the Saracens in 1099. Godefroy established the order in that year to commemorate his great victory, founding an order of knights dedicated to the protection of holy places and pilgrims.
